

Introduction

What is Notfox?

The website NotFox.com was launched in 2015 as a tool to track the confluence of news headlines across the major news providers: ABC, CBS, CNN, Fox, NBC, Newsmax (more recently) and NPR. The site quietly and consistently gathers headlines based on keyword overlap, presents them for real-time evaluation to any site visitors, and logs them away for further study and use.

One of the primary features of NotFox.com is the way it sorts and presents the news of the day. Rather than just providing a list of headlines, it looks at subjects (keywords) that are being talked about across multiple outlets, and prioritizes the ones that are getting the most attention, in real time. The result is an instant, overarching view of the ideas that media outlets are promoting. As anyone who has examined the news knows, the industry players always act in tandem, and are entirely centered around agenda setting theory and the cognitive accessibility of their agendas. NotFox.com provides a way to watch that activity unfold

For the most part, modern news is highly perishable, and the primarily usage of NotFox.com reflects that reality. With the much-hyped, "twenty-four hour news cycle," and the endless advents of ever-more-impressive distribution technologies, most subjects flit in and out of societal consciousness for only moments at a time. If we still had presses, they'd be yet hot while we moved on to the next new and shiny subject. But thanks to the database storage of headlines going back for years, NotFox.com also has the ability to let us peer into the

past of the news media—ground that we're really not meant to tread on—through reports on the site itself, and through books like this one.

What are Headline Histories?

Internet news headlines are the most perishable of all public thoughts, even more so than the articles they entitle. By and large, we consume headlines and articles in a moment, and then move on to the next ones that are always overflowing in the queue.

Headline Histories from NotFox.com give us an opportunity to look back. They leverage the vast database of collected headlines, and organize them into a consumable format. They offer headlines as a history in and of themselves, a frozen snapshot in time. Because they are available in print form only, they offer a durable memory that we can learn from and keep.

Why "Trump in the News"?

Then acting White House chief of staff Mick Mulvaney said in an interview with CBS in 2019 that, "Everything [Donald Trump] says is offensive to some people." As a political apparatus, Trump's brand was designed to have this offensive effect, and all those who have and do participate in the marketing of his brand fall victim to that reality at some point. For that reason, putting this particular volume together was a terrifying prospect; I knew going in that there would be no way to please my readers.

My selection of headlines (or my omission), my selection of bold items (or items I didn't bold), my chapter headings, as well as every original word herein, are likely to offend *all* of my readers at intervals. But being calm and content is not why people read about Donald Trump—and in any case, this volume

isn't about him as much as it is about his treatment in the media.

Though I've tried to keep *most* of my personal opinions out of the front and rear matter of this book, I am conscious of the desire people have to polarize around Trump. I'm also well aware of the triage traps that talking about Trump automatically entails. I can in all honesty say that I view myself as ambivalent on Donald Trump, neither for nor against. But I am very much against manipulative media, and no topic in my lifetime has exposed more manipulation than this one; that has been my motivation in running Notfox, and in producing this book.

Even with the evident risks, I felt that it was important to preserve a record of the news media's treatment of Donald Trump. In my personal opinion, there is no way that an industry as calculating and experienced as the mass media stumbled onto the stage with Trump; they must have been implicit from the start. When their treatment of him is viewed at a distance and with the perspective of hindsight, this becomes evident.

Not only is the preservation of Trump headlines in this book valuable as a piece of history, it has a peculiar value for any who would like to view agenda setting theory, and especially salience models, in wild and ferocious action. Few news subjects reveal media methods the way Trump does.

The Format of This Book

This book was curated, formatted, and assembled by hand, without the use of Artificial Intelligence which is so prevalent today. The Notfox database has millions of headline entries, which could not possibly all fit in a reasonable volume. So, I selected headlines that were applicable, and formatted them as if they were the text of a novel using the statistical analysis

language R. Additional modifications, including highlights and dates, were then added.

Some might argue that a list format would have made more sense, lending itself to better sorting and organization. Headlines are, after all, usually presented as a list. However, as a history, it made more sense in my mind to present these headlines in the form of a disjointed story. The novel format gives the headlines an absurd quality when read through, and owing to the fact that they are in chronological order, the continuity and readability are tolerable.

Each chapter represents a span of time, and begins with a related relevant headline as the chapter title. The "paragraphs" are primarily collections of headlines tacked together like an irrational train of thought. Headline dates should be largely accurate, but remember that the dates represent the point at which the article was entered into the NotFox.com database, and not necessarily the publication date.

Even though I've worked on this book by hand, thousands of headlines and tens of thousands of words mean that some mistakes are likely. As I had to process some of the data manually, there will certainly be headlines that contain punctuation problems, and headlines that contain grammatical errors (including some that were put there by their original creators). Also, news outlets adopt varying capitalization rules, which have mostly been preserved. It is assumed that the reader will treat this collection of headlines with about as much dignity that they treat headlines in general, and take the errors lightly.

A Note on Biases

You can't gather news headlines without gathering associated biases. Various news outlets have claimed, over the years, to have some level of integrity and objectivity, but readers have either doubted these claims (in the case of news they don't

agree with) or argued their merits (in the case of news they do agree with).

The subject matter of Donald Trump's presidency adds additional complexity when it comes to the issue of biases, because his entire brand is conflict. On his own he is polarizing enough, but the fuel that media outlets have intentionally thrown on that obtrusive facet of his personality has been breathtaking. There is no doubt in my mind that the modern media has altogether abandoned the idea of being objective, fair, or even remotely honest.

And so, I don't pretend to present a book without biases: in fact, I openly acknowledge that this book is chock-full of them. That said, the biases you'll find in this book are largely imported with the headlines themselves. My curation and introductory materials may well have introduced additional biases, because I am human, but I have attempted to present a large collection of information that represents the history of the news, and not my own views.

A Note on Copyrights

I was, at first, hesitant to approach the idea of publishing an entire book based on headlines that were written by thousands of journalists. There was, in point of fact, no reasonable way for me to obtain permission to create such a beast, nor any way for me to credit them individually. The idea gnawed at me enough, and I ended by researching the copyright question as deeply as I could. My findings have led me to believe that U.S. copyright law, to the best of my understanding, does not require me to obtain said permission. My position rests on three points: *De minimis* authorship and creativity in the selected headlines; effect of the use upon the potential market; and, whether or not the created product is transformative in nature.

The U.S. Copyright Office Circular 33, Works Not Protected by Copyright (March 2021), covers theses issue in part. But the topic is covered even more extensively and specifically in the publication titled Copyright Protections for Press Publishers, A Report of the Register of Copyrights (June 2022); and even further in the publication titled Written Additional Comments in Response to U. S. Copyright Office's Publishers' Protection Study: Request for Additional Comments, 86 Fed. Reg. 62,215 (Nov. 9, 2021).

In the latter two above publications, the U.S. Copyright Office was specifically considering whether news publishers needed additional copyright protections against news aggregator websites (such as NotFox.com). Ultimately, the Copyright Office ruled that no additional protections were needful. In the course of that ruling and its associated research, they covered the question of headlines and "short phrases" quite extensively.

Jane C. Ginsburg seems to have led the legal investigation on the protectability of "short phrases" and headlines. Ultimately, the Copyright Office noted that in some cases headlines may be eligible for copyright protections. They noted that there were, "three arguments as to why some headlines and ledes should be protectable: first, that courts applying the short phrases doctrine have focused on originality or functionality rather than brevity as such, leaving open the possibility that a sufficiently original short phrase might be copyrightable; second, that the examples given by the Compendium of non-protectable words and short phrases—names of individuals or organizations, titles, catchwords, or slogans—tend either to lack all originality or be 'considerably more brief than most headlines or ledes'; and third, that a rule based solely on brevity, without any guide as to how short is too short, could be difficult to implement."

This speaks to the *de minimis* argument, primarily, and establishes that shortness alone cannot stand as a reason to deny protection. In other words, headlines aren't free to be

copied without permission solely on the basis of their brevity—they must also lack creativity or originality. To answer this concern, my solution has been to individually curate headlines and filter out any that appear to have a scintilla of creativity and originality. Authors of headlines may or may not agree with my determinations and may certainly object to my judgment, but I have made a good faith effort to include only headlines that are primarily factual, short phrases that are in fact not protectable.

As for the effect of my use on the potential market of news publishers, I can only suppose that curating and reshaping old headlines (old being a relative idea, but strongly on my side of the argument as the word relates to news in particular) would have no impact whatsoever on the news industry, as I am presenting nothing new. I'm not aware of anyone having done what I am attempting in this book, and so I have no metrics to measure against. Even so, I am confident that I am not competing with any news publisher or journalist whatsoever. In fact, as with NotFox.com, these headlines may very well serve as an invitation for readers to utilize online search tools to look up the articles that they refer to, driving business toward news publishers. Therefore, I feel that this second point is addressed.

To the last point—whether this work is transformative in nature—I simply assert that creating a novel out of headlines is absolutely transformative in every sense. I have taken headlines, which have real value only in the very short-term, and turned them into a sort of durable and fascinating history. This provides the public with a benefit that didn't exist when the headlines were created, and salvages those same headlines from almost certain extinction in the public eye, preserving what would otherwise become largely lost to view.

Though I am nothing akin to a lawyer, it is my opinion that I have satisfied the legal tests that might have stood in the way of the publication of a work based on headlines, and have made a

good faith effort to avoid infringing on the rights of other authors or publishers.

As for the copyrights that I myself claim, they of course exclude the non-copyrightable headlines themselves, and rest solely on my particular organization and presentation of the same.

Without these news outlets, the NotFox.com project would be impossible, and this book would be impossible. Without the contributions of countless journalists, none of this would be possible. Just as the NotFox.com aggregator cannot credit each individual author due to technical limitations, I cannot credit every author of the headlines that this book is built on. Their contributions are nevertheless appreciated and meaningful.

Salience and Agenda Setting Language

Anyone who sets out to truly understand the news media eventually finds the topic of Agenda Setting Theory. The ideas in that theory have been methodically researched since the 1970's under that moniker, but the driving concepts go back much further.

If the term is new, or you are completely unfamiliar with the field, any academic research portal will provide you with endless reading on the subject. Within the broader subject is the concept of salience—the neurological fact that issues which are presented with greater frequency are perceived as more important.

An Example: "Insurrection"

A suitable example of Agenda Setting and Salience is to be found in the events which took place at the Capital on January 6th, 2021. These events were reported primarily as a "riot" at first, after very early attempts to frame those events as an "insurrection" fell flat. Later experiments at the term "attempted coup" and "siege" also failed. Whether insurrection was truly accepted in the public eye or not, the media eventually settled on its use, roughly a year after the events—enough time for most people to allow their notions to be shaped more by messaging than memory. Agenda Setting language frequently goes through iterations, depending on how the language and message are received; this event and its language are interesting examples of that process.

As you read through the headlines in this book, pay attention to ideas and language that are repeated. Some rhetorical language to watch for includes words such as: Baseless, collusion, conspiracy theory, deniers, downplays, unprecedented, troubling, embarrassment, urgent threat, worst, truth, lie, striking contrast, failing, attacks, slams, furious, racist, boasting, and unprecedented. Keep in mind that whether or not such language is warranted is rarely addressed with any degree of completeness in a news article; yet, such language is commonplace and purposeful.

CHAPTER 1

Inlike the rest of the chapters in this book, I chose to begin this one with a notice. Some readers have a tendency to bypass the introductory material of an average book, and dive right in at Chapter One. While this is not normally a grave concern, in the case of this book I fear such an action would lead to abject befuddlement, confusion, frustration, or even irritation. This is not a book in which you can skip the introduction, as it is not an average book.

If you haven't read the introduction, I encourage you to do so. If you're unwilling, I'll give you the summary: This book is a curated collection of headlines from the period of 2017 to 2023, related to Donald Trump. It is formatted to read like a novel, but the words are in fact actual headlines that passed through the website NotFox.com over the course of that period. It will not read like a regular novel, it will read like headlines broken into paragraphs and chapters. It is bizarre by design. Enjoy!
